
Project overview

Purpose:

Relieve Traffic congestion along Hoffman St

Divert traffic to the safer signalized intersection at Sutter St and SR 49/88




Also provides pedestrian improvements including sidewalk gap closure.









Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program

Mitigation Measures Identified in IS/MND:

- BMPs including geotechnical design recommendations, construction traffic control, construction noise control, storm water pollution prevent plan, & air quality measures during construction
- Tree protection and replacement and minimizing visual impacts
- Community air monitoring plan during construction
- Protect valley elderberry longhorn beetle, special status bats, migratory/nesting birds, special status reptiles, and terrestrial animals
- Protect sensitive natural communities and wetlands
- Protect archaeological resources, human remains, and paleo resources if encountered
- Management and disposal of contaminated soil
- Reduce wildland fire hazards during construction
- Implement noise barrier into project design

CEQA Review Summary and Recommendations

Summary

- Project evaluated in accordance with CEQA Guidelines
- Potential impacts can be mitigated to less-than-significant level
- No significant unavoidable impacts identified
- Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program developed to ensure compliance with mitigation measures identified in IS/MND

Recommendation

 Staff recommends the Mitigated Negative Declaration be adopted, the Mitigation Monitoring Program be adopted, the Project be approved, and a Notice of Determination be filed for the Project with the Amador County Clerk and the State Clearinghouse
