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## INTRODUCTION

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This report summarizes the public participation and input received during the General Plan Update Visioning Workshop outreach activities conducted in March and June 2021.

The City of Jackson initiated their General Plan Update process in early 2021 and began a multifaceted outreach program to engage community members. The outreach program for this project is inclusive, educational, and designed to facilitate a meaningful conversation with the City of Jackson community about the issues and challenges facing Jackson, which should be addressed as part of the General Plan Update.

The outreach program has included both in-person workshops and an online survey, which were conducted to provide opportunities for community members to discuss their vision for the future of the City of Jackson, issues related to transportation and mobility, land use and community priorities, and other relevant topics, such as environmental justice.

The General Plan update effort will continue to provide opportunities for the public to learn about the project and provide their input.

This Summary Report memorializes what was discussed during the project kickoff workshop with the Planning Commission and City Council, the community Visioning Workshop, and an online survey which was completed by 489 participants. These activities occurred throughout the Spring of 2021

# COMMUNITY VISIONING WORKSHOPS

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The City hosted two General Plan Update Visioning Workshops in March and June of 2021. The Workshops focused on a variety of topics, and included a brief overview of the General Plan, including why it's important and why the City is updating its Plan, some background information on the evening's topic, and a series of facilitated activities to solicit input on key topics or ideas. The topics explored in each Workshop along with summaries of what we heard from the community are provided on the following pages. The intent of this Summary Report is to present the information we received without making assumptions or recommendations. The feedback we received has been recorded here in order to memorialize the key themes and ideas, and it will be used to help inform future work tasks associated with the General Plan Update, including the creation of new goals, policies, and actions.

## Activity #1: Assets, Challenges, and Vision Activity

The General Plan Visioning Workshop was held on Monday June 7, 2021 @ 6:00 pm in the City Hall Civic Center and the Planning Commission/City Council workshop was held on March 29, 2021. The intent of these Workshops is to begin a dialogue with the community regarding its priorities for the next 20 years. Following a brief presentation on the General Plan Update, the consultant team facilitated activities to help conduct this conversation. These activities are summarized on the following pages.

**Activity - Assets, Vision, and Challenges Brainstorming:** The first activity was an individual exercise. Meeting attendees were provided stacks of blank Post-It-Notes and asked to write down what they think are Jackson’s biggest assets and challenges, along with their vision for the future of Jackson. The results are summarized by topic area on the following pages. Questions posed to the group for their consideration included:

## Activity #2: Visions

The second activity as part of the Visioning Workshops addressed the need to craft a long-term Vision Statement. A Vision Statement is a description of what Jackson wants to become through the implementation of the General Plan. It provides a sense of purpose and mission for the General Plan, and sets the tone for the Plan's guiding principles to aid in the development of goals, policies and actions that will guide development in the coming years.

**Activity – Community Brainstorming:** Working in groups of 3-6, participants were asked to brainstorm key words and ideas into a vision. An example of the Community Brainstorming activity is included below. The full brainstorming activity is provided in Appendix B.



**Activity – Jackson Postcard:** Individually, participants were then asked to write a postcard from their future selves which describes what they want their community to be. An example of the Postcard activity is provided below, all other postcards are included in Appendix B.

*I Just left Jackson and it is an amazing place to come play and stay. I jumped from the trolley and it took me to the most amazing cemetery. It was creepy cool with innovative scan bars each you could scan with your phone and it would tell you the complete history of Jackson. Also the trolley to me to the mines on a guided tour. I stopped by downtown for shopping and a little lunch at Rose Bud (what you've never heard of rose bud?) It's farm to fork and absolutely the best! After lunch we cooled down by the Riverwalk and had drinks. What a trip it was!*

## Activity #3: Mobility Mapping Activity

### Activity – Mobility Mapping:

The third and final activity of the Visioning Workshop asked participants to review large-scale maps of the City and highlight areas that need special focused attention as part of the General Plan Update for circulation and mobility in Jackson, including how people get around (cars, walking, biking, and transit), road safety, and local conditions. Working in small groups, attendees were asked to use colored markers to provide input on the following:

**Green – Bicycle-Related:** e.g. lack of bike facilities, uncomfortable existing bike facilities

**Red – Safety-Related:** e.g. safety issues for automobiles, bicycles, or pedestrians, collisions, unsafe routes for students to get to school, etc.

**Blue – Pedestrian-Related:** e.g. lack of crosswalks, missing sidewalks, uncomfortable/difficult crossings

**Black – Automobile-Related:** e.g. traffic congestion, cut-thru traffic, speeding

Following an instruction guide, the small groups used colored markers to identify special types of areas. The instructions guide used by meeting participants and copies of completed maps are included in Appendix C. After working on the maps, each table reported back to the entire group summarizing their key ideas.

### **Mobility Mapping Results (Common Themes):**

- Improve, expand and provide Bicycle and Pedestrian paths to and from residential areas to commercial areas in Jackson and along highway 49.
- Reducing traffic speed and incorporating pedestrian safety measures (crosswalks, caution lights, medians, etc.) within and near Downtown Jackson along Highway 49 and Highway 88.
- Easing traffic congestion through Downtown Jackson along Highway 88 and Highway 49.
- Pedestrian connections and trails between residential areas.
- Constructing a bypass from Highway 49 to Highway 88.
- Reducing heavy trucking through Downtown Jackson and residential areas.

## **ONLINE SURVEY**

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### ***Introduction***

This section provides a summary of responses and feedback from the City of Jackson General Plan Update Survey facilitated online. Survey responses were administered online via the City's website and the SurveyMonkey web platform. During the time period that the survey was active (May 17, 2021 through July 15, 2021), there were 489 responses to the eighteen primary questions related to the General Plan update. The questions involved a wide range of response formats that are synthesized in this brief report. The survey responses provide insight into the demographics and opinions of the City of Jackson community members concerning goals and topics related to the update of the City's General Plan.

Please note that the following summaries included in this report are not exhaustive and do not include references to every comment received in the survey. Specific comments and individual responses can be accessed by looking at the complete survey results attached as Appendix D.

## **Online Survey Summary**

### **Question 1: Do you live in the City of Jackson?**

Of the respondents to the survey, 49 percent reported living in Jackson. 51 percent of respondents to the survey reported living in areas outside Jackson.

### **Question 2: How Long have you lived in Jackson?**

A majority (approximately 47 percent of survey respondents) have lived within the City of Jackson for over 15+ years. Approximately 9 percent have lived in Jackson for 11-15 years, approximately 18 percent for 6-10 years, approximately 20 percent for 2-5 years, and approximately 6 percent for less than 2 years.

### **Question 3: If you live outside of Jackson where do you live?**

Of the respondents that lived outside Jackson, 64 respondents lived in Lone, 48 Lived in Pine Grove, 31 lived in Pioneer, 8 lived in Plymouth, 52 lived in Sutter Creek, and 6 lived in Volcano, and 27 lived in other communities.

**Question 4: Do you work in Jackson?** Of the survey respondents, 38 percent worked in communities other than Jackson, 17 percent are retired, 1 percent are students, 33 percent are employed by other in Jackson and 11 percent own their own business in Jackson.

### **Question 5: How Long have you owned the business?**

Of the respondents who owned their own business approximately 35 percent have owned it for longer than 20 years, 27 percent have owned it 10-20 years, 10 percent have owned it for 6-10 years, 19 percent have owned it for 2-5 years, and 8 percent have owned it for less than 2 years.

### **Question 6: How would you rate the quality of Life in Jackson?**

Of the survey respondents, 4 percent rated the quality of life in Jackson as 'Poor', 27 percent as 'Fair', 58 percent as 'Good', and 11 percent as 'Excellent.'

### **Question 7: What would you like to see more of in Jackson? (Pick three)**

Survey respondents had the ability to pick up to three options from a list of various different amenities or opportunities that could be incorporated more into Jackson. The most frequently chosen answers were: restaurants, shops, entertainment/cultural facilities, jobs, and walking path/ trails. The top 9 results are included below:

- Parks/recreation – 58%
- Entertainment facilities – 54%
- Restaurants – 48%
- Shops – 34%
- Cultural events – 33%
- Public gathering places – 30%
- Variety of housing choices – 28%
- Other (please specify) – 28%
- Offices -3%

### **Question 8: Are there enough employment opportunities in Jackson?**

Of the survey respondents 61% responded that there were not enough employment opportunities in Jackson, 39 percent responded that Jackson had enough employment opportunities.

**Question 9: Are there enough parks and recreational resources in Jackson?**

14 percent of respondents identified that Jackson has enough parks and recreational facilities. Approximately 40 percent of respondents identified a need for more neighborhood and regional parks, while 19 percent identified needing more sports fields.

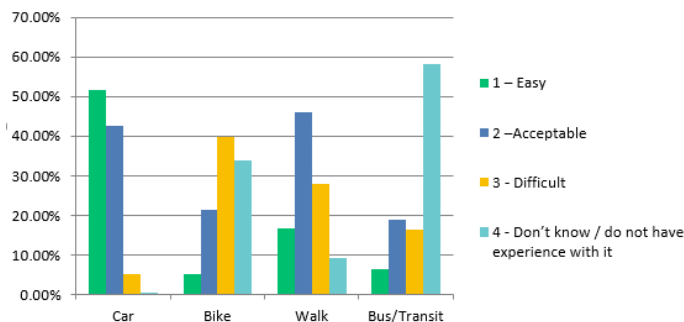
**Question 10: What types of jobs or industries should Jackson try to attract? (Pick up to three)**

Participants in the survey had the option to choose up to three specific industry/job areas to select as job types that the City of Jackson should attempt to attract. The preferred job identified by participants in descending order were:

- Retail and sales – 52%
- Medical – 46%
- Professional – 24%
- Hi-tech – 41%
- Service and trades – 40%
- "Green" industries – 40%
- Manufacturing – 38%

**Question 11: How easy is it to move in and around Jackson using: car, bike, walk, or bus?**

Survey respondents were given the option of rating the usability of four different modes of transportation (Car, Bike, Walk, or Bus) as either 'Easy', 'Acceptable', or 'Difficult'. The bar graph below depicts the results of Question 11.



**Question 12: Please rate your level of satisfaction on a scale from 1 to 5**

Question 12 allowed respondents to rank their satisfaction with each of the 12 topic areas provided. The topic areas where a majority of the respondents used **favorable** descriptors- 'Somewhat Satisfied' or 'Very Satisfied' include:

- Jackson as a place to live
- Fire and emergency medical services
- Medical Services
- Police services

Topic areas where a majority of the respondents used **unfavorable** descriptors- 'Mixed', 'Somewhat Dissatisfied', or 'Very Dissatisfied'- include:

- Community gatherings and events
- Arts and cultural programs
- Recreational activities for adults
- Traffic flow in and through the City
- Availability of parking in the downtown/central area
- Recreational activities for children

**Question 13: Rank the priority of the General Plan addressing the following issues on a scale of 1 to 5.**

Question 13 allowed respondents to rank their satisfaction with each of the 32 topic areas provided. The topic areas where a majority of the respondents used **higher-priority** descriptors- 'Very Important,' 'Important,' or 'Some Important' include:

- Retain the community's small-town character
- Safety and security
- Fire and emergency medical services
- Police services
- Schools
- Recreational activities for children
- Medical Services
- Protect the character of existing residential neighborhoods
- Prioritize economic growth/job creation
- Preserve and protect historical structures, facilities and other locations
- Enhance programs for youth and teens
- Maintaining public safety services
- Provide more bike paths, trails, and sidewalks throughout the community
- Provide more housing for all income levels
- Protect the character of existing residential neighborhoods
- Attract shops and restaurants
- Prioritize economic growth/job creation
- Community gatherings and events
- Arts and cultural programs
- Preserve wildlife habitat
- Support, maintain and enhance art and cultural events
- Increase the amount of parks/open spaces and facilities

Topic areas where a high amount of the respondents used **lower-priority** descriptors- 'Low Importance' or 'Not Important' include:

- Encourage alternatives to driving
- Encourage use of renewable and alternative energy

**Question 14: In a few words tell us what you value most about Jackson? What makes this a special place to live or work?** Question 14 provided respondents the opportunity to elaborate on their values and what makes Jackson a special place to live or work. Responses to Question 14 were highly variable. To see responses to Question 14, please see the attached raw survey data contained in Appendix D.

**Question 15: What issues are facing the City that need to be addressed in the General Plan Update?** Question 15 provided respondents the opportunity to elaborate on the issues facing the city. Responses to Question 15 were highly variable. To see responses to Question 15, please see the attached raw survey data contained in Appendix D.

**Question 17: Thinking about the future of Jackson, what three words or phrases best describe how you would like to see the community in 20 years?** Question 16 provided respondents the opportunity to elaborate on how they would like to see the community in 20 years. Responses to Question 16 were highly variable. To see responses to Question 16, please see the attached raw survey data contained in Appendix D.

**Question 18: If you would like to receive notifications for upcoming General Plan Update events or be notified when draft documents are available for your review, please provide your email address.** Question 18 provided respondents the opportunity to share their email address to be included on the General Plan Updates noticing list. The responses for the question will be used by the City to keep the interested individuals informed of upcoming events and reports, but results have been excluded from this document and Appendix D to ensure survey respondents' privacy.

## NEXT STEPS

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The goal of the Visioning Workshops and online survey was to start a conversation with the City of Jackson community regarding their vision for the City and how the General Plan should address key issues, opportunities, and challenges that are most important to the City of Jackson. Using this feedback, City staff and the General Plan Update consultant team will begin to draft goals, policies, and actions for the new General Plan. This community feedback will also serve as a resource for the Jackson Planning Commission and City Council as they review and provide input on draft products developed by the project team.

The homeless problem was solved with safe camp spaces, tiny houses, a new transfer park, and co-ordinated services. No one believes that we once had a large unhoused population here.

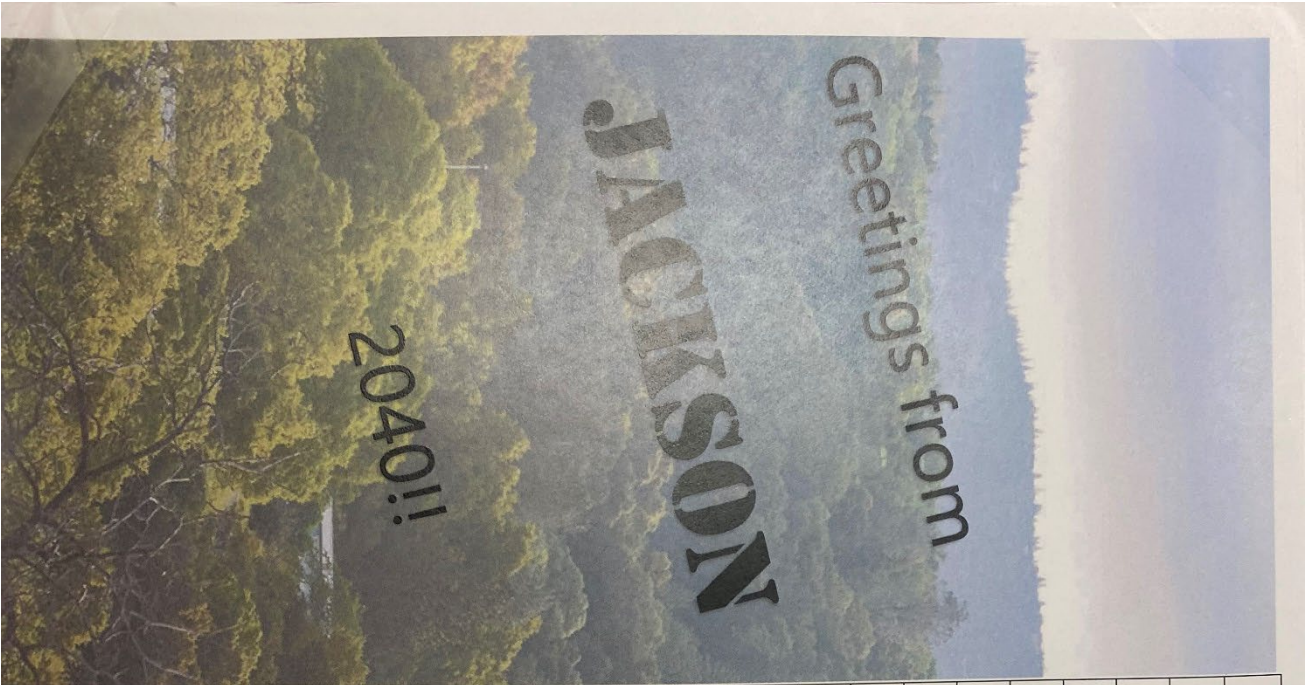

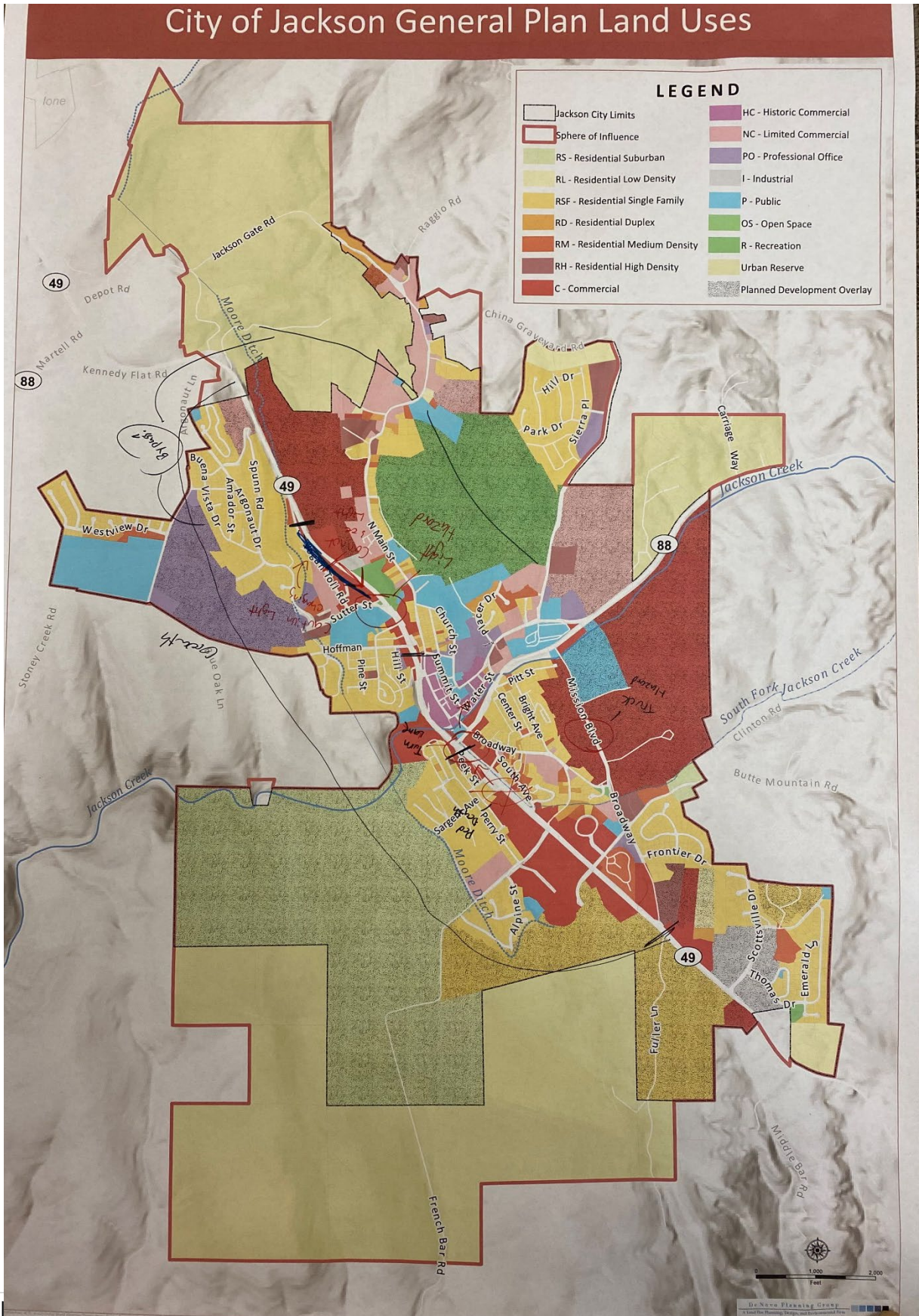
# City of Jackson General Plan Land Uses



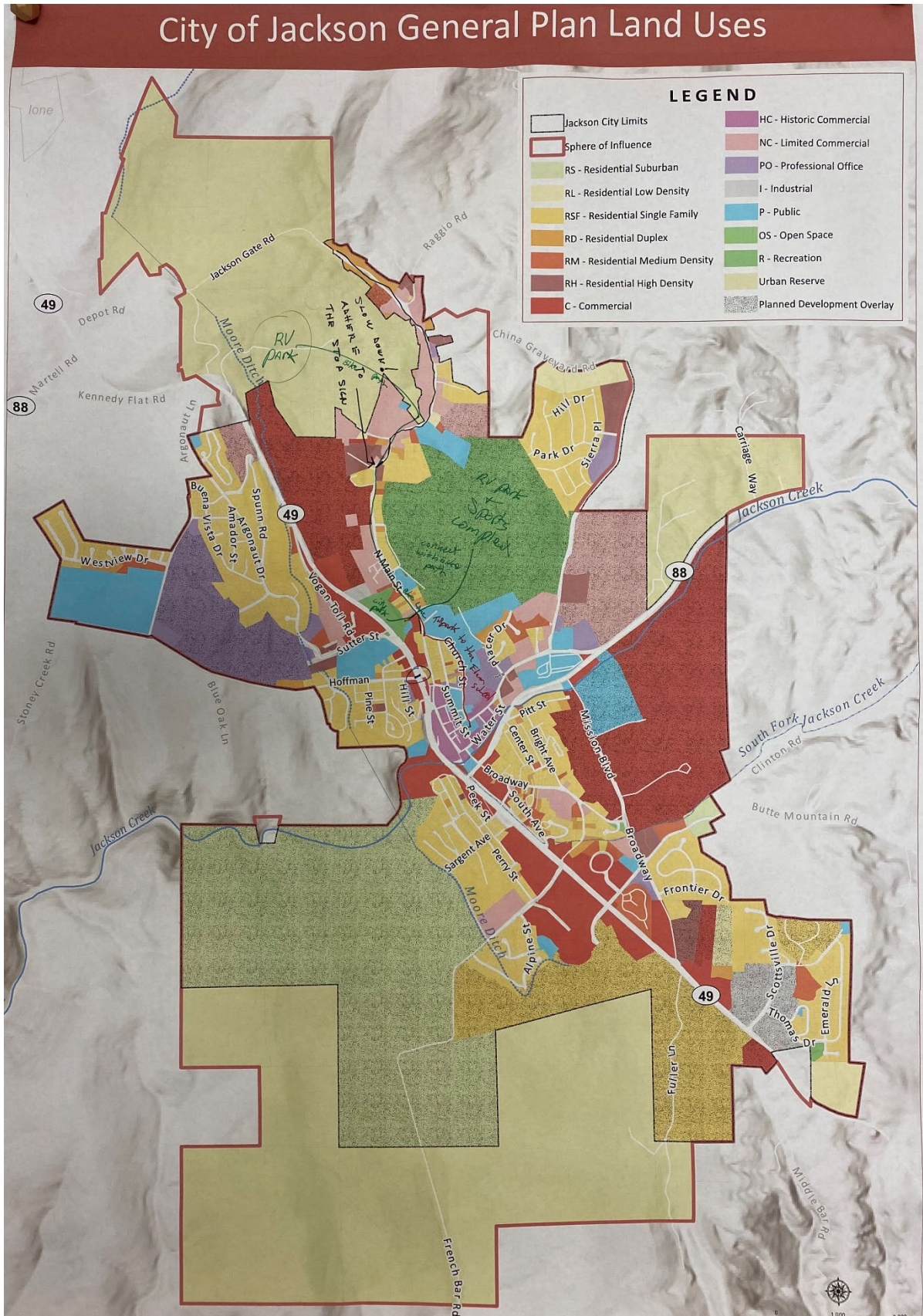




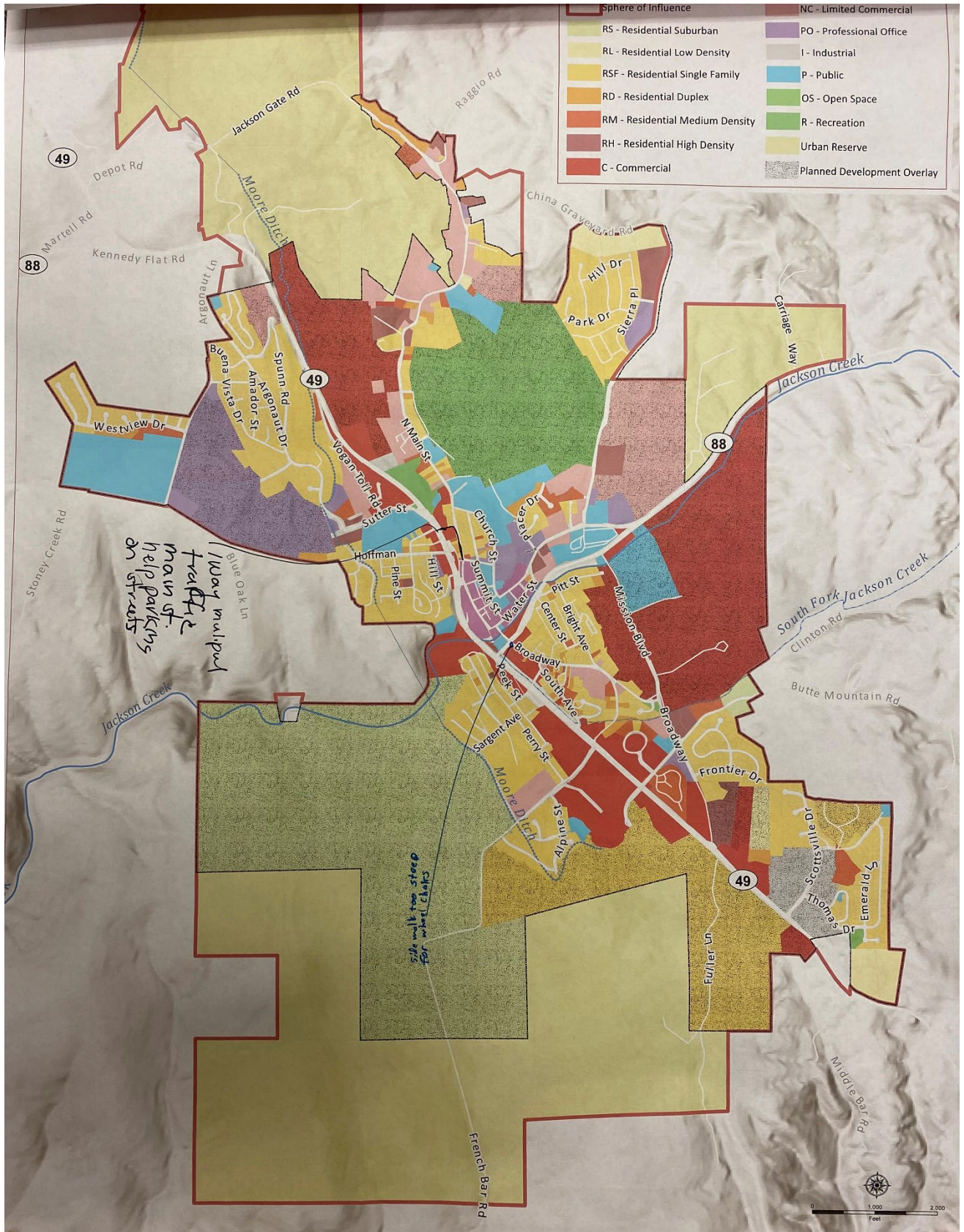

#### How would you rate the quality of life in Jackson?

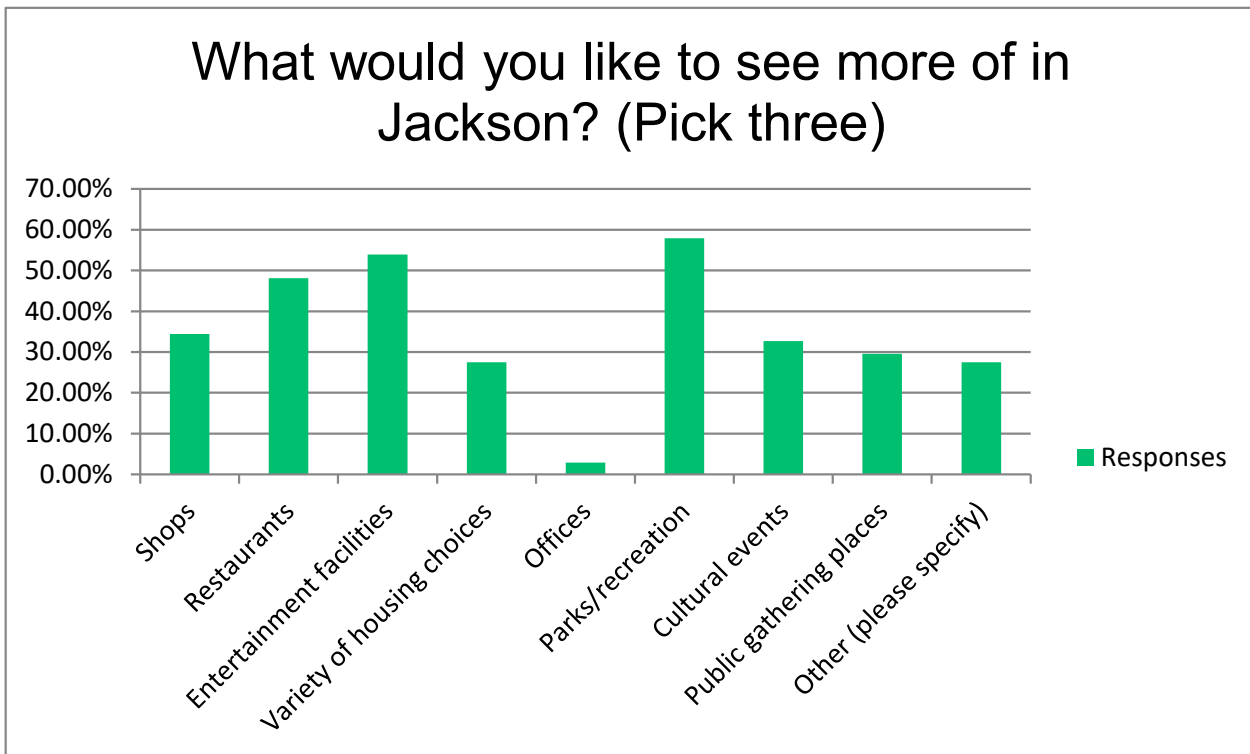
